The Pittsford & Brandon Rec. Depts. are co-sponsoring a Ski/Snowboard Program. This program is being held at the Middlebury Snow Bowl on four Sunday mornings from March 3-24 and consists of four 1-hour lessons and half day tickets. LISTERS

FIRES OR NATURAL DISASTERS

Property owners should report to the Listers Office any fires or natural disasters that reduce the value of their property so that adjustments can be made in the assessment of their property. Property owners who have suffered damage to their property should send a letter to the Town Clerk requesting partial abatement of current year tax.

HOMESTEAD DECLARATION

The Vermont Tax Dept. has a new HS 122 (Homestead Declaration) two part form which is in the Vermont Tax booklet and on the tax dept. website: state.vt.us/tax/pvr. All property owners who are residents are required to submit this form. The form is also available at our Library and library staff can assist residents in filing this form. There is also a form HS 122W for withdrawals.

PERSONAL PROPERTY FORMS

Personal Property forms will go out to all businesses in March. We ask that forms be completed showing all equipment, year purchased and cost. You can refer to last year's filing and add any equipment acquired in 2012.

DOG OWNERSHIP RULES

The Town learned during its recent "dog census" that many dog-owners weren't familiar with the laws regarding dog ownership in Town. For example, did you know that all dogs must be registered with the Town each year? Did you know that dog owners must provide evidence of rabies vaccinations for each dog, as well? Did you know that dog owners must keep their dogs on their own property or under physical or voice control at all times?

Some of these rules are simply good manners and designed to keep the peace in your neighborhood. Others are matters of public health and safety. All are spelled out in detail in the Town's Animal Ordinance, a copy of which is posted online at www.pittsfordvermont.com.

LOTHROP SCHOOL BOARD DIRECTORS



As 2013 begins, Lothrop Elementary continues to celebrate 100 years of serving students, families and the greater community. Throughout the school year, the staff has joined forces to create unique interdisciplinary opportunities to engage students and enrich student learning. Most recently they concluded a month-long African studies unit that included lessons in music, art, PE, French, and social studies. This is one of many collaborative efforts happening at the school. Others, including composting and recycling initiatives, can be viewed on the newly updated website:

During this year's budget season, the school board and administration have worked together to build a budget that focuses on providing quality programs that will enhance student learning while still responding to current economic conditions and the needs of the community. At Town Meeting, held March 4th, the School Board of Directors for Lothrop Elementary will present a proposed 2013-14 budget of \$3,765,871, up slightly more than 3% over last year. This budget reflects increases in the RNESU assessment, operations costs and wages. It also reflects many small reductions in line items, but does not propose any reductions in programming. In fact, the administration has recommended an increase in the music program, bringing that position to full-time, in order to expand learning opportunities to more students.

Community involvement and attendance at meetings is welcomed. School Board Meetings are held the first Tuesday of every month at 6:30 pm in the Lothrop School Library. Additional information can be found on the website.

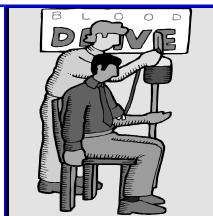

PITTSFORD HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The first stage of the Pittsford Historical Society's weatherization of Eaton Hall last year has resulted in a startling reduction in fuel oil consumption. According to Keyser Energy in Proctor, we burned 300 gallons between Sept. 1, 2012 and Jan. 15, 2013. That's 200 gallons less burned from same period last year. We spent \$5,200 to complete Stage One, resulting in savings to day of \$696.60 for fuel oil. Add a \$1,614 cash incentive from Efficiency Vermont. Absolute Comfort, the Middlebury contractor, added a generous rebate, making a total cost of about \$2,500 for State One.

Museum curator Anne Pelkey notices the much warmer front entry and basement and a more comfortable exhibit room every time she goes in.

This year we are seeking donations from Society members and local friends to complete the job by air sealing and insulating the first and second floor outer walls. By contracting for the \$8,800 estimated cost, we can qualify for \$4,078 in rebates and reduce the total cost from \$16,200 to about \$12,000. Please make checks payable to Pittsford Historical Society inc. and mail them to Terri Davis, Treasurer, P O Box 423, Pittsford, VT 05763. Anonymous donations are welcome and thank you.

2012 officers and trustees were reelected for 2013 except new trustee Mark Mooney. He replaces Ernie Brod, who withdrew at the end of his second year. Mooney is a Pittsford native and 1961 graduate of Pittsford High School. He and his wife Nancy live in Middlebury.

Society volunteer Stephen Belcher is compiling a photo album of Pittsford war veterans. He hopes readers will loan him their photos of military men and women long enough to scan the, especially veterans of recent and current conflicts. Steve's phone number is 802-483-2852.

DOG LICENSES DUE APRIL 1, 2013

Please note that dog licenses are now available at the Pittsford Town Office. All dogs must be registered by **April 1st**. In order to register your dog, you must give the Town Office a copy of the most recent rabies vaccination certificate. Your veterinarian always gives you two copies, one for your files and one for our files. If you are unsure whether your dog's rabies certificate is up to date, please call your veterinarian or us at (802) 483-6500 Ext. 11, 12, 13, or 24.

The fees to register your dog(s) are as follows:

Female Spayed	\$8	\$2
Male Neutered	\$8	\$2

Please be aware that you may need a kennel license if you are: **"The owner or keeper of two or more domestic pets OR wolf-hybrids four months of age or older kept for sale or for breeding purposes"**.

DOG LICENSE REMINDER—DOG TAGS ARE IN. DOGS ARE REQUIRED TO BE LICENSED EACH YEAR WITH THE TOWN BY **APRIL 1, 2013. Don't wait until the last day.** A RABIES CERTIFICATE IS REQUIRED. IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY REGISTERED YOUR DOG, PLEASE STOP BY THE TOWN OFFICE **BEFORE APRIL 1, 2013.** The next rabies clinic by the Town will be in 2015.
