WATER SYSTEM EXPANSION & NEW WATER & SEWER COMMISSIONER

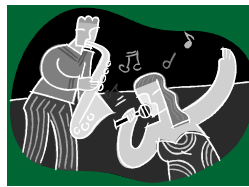
Summer will see the construction project designed to expand the Town's water system and take on new rate-paying customers. As you may recall, last summer, the Town's voters approved funding for a \$260,000.00 project in which the Town would connect the new Route 7 (south) water main into the infrastructure of Fire District #1 (Orchard Hill), taking on those folks as new rate-payers, and continuing up to the Country Club and 7 residences tied into the Proctor Water service line which is soon to be abandoned by Proctor. The result will be 37 new water customers and revenue which will more than cover the costs of construction.

The Water & Sewer Commission is pleased to announce that Dave Pearson of the Fire District #1 has joined the Water & Sewer Commission to fill the spot recently vacated by David Boles. Dave will be a valuable addition to the Commission as he has extensive experience in running a water system and knows well the infrastructure and customers which will soon be taken on by the Town in the water system expansion project described above.

Please note that the next utility bills will be going out in July.

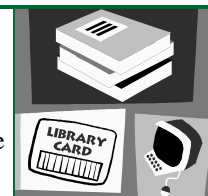

AARP SAFE DRIVER COURSE



The Pittsford Recreation Department will be sponsoring the AARP Safe Driver Course (formerly "55-Alive") on Tuesday, June 4, 2013 at the Pittsford Town Offices. This 4.5 hour course is open to all drivers 50 years old and older. The curriculum addresses the normal physical changes brought on by the aging process, how these changes can affect driving ability and behavior and then offers ways to compensate for those changes. There are no tests and no grades!

The training will be offered from 9:00 am – 2:00 pm. There will be a thirty minute lunch break. Folks will be responsible for their own lunches. The fee for the course is \$14 (AARP members get a \$2 discount. An AARP membership number is needed at registration.)

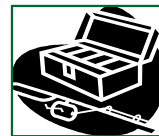

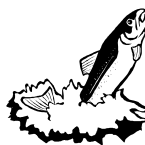

LISTERS' REPORT

VETERANS EXEMPTION Veterans who are residents of Pittsford, with a disability of 50% or more, are entitled to a \$40,000 exemption off assessed value for tax purposes. Those veterans should receive a letter and form from the Office of Veterans Affairs which should be signed and returned. If a veteran is qualified but has not received a letter, we suggest a call to the VA office at 802-828-3379. Application forms are also available at the Town office or on the State website, state.vt.us.gov.

HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION Once again, all resident homeowners are required to file the Homestead Exemption (HS-122) which can be found in the Vermont Tax booklet available at the Town Office, Maclure Library or on line at: state.vt.us.gov/tax. Late filing will be accepted through October 15 but a late filing penalty will apply.

REMOVING EXISTING STRUCTURE Please note that taxpayers should apply for a permit to remove existing buildings from his or her property. With this information, Listers will be able to adjust the property valuation accordingly.

GRIEVANCE Homeowners will receive a letter regarding the grievance procedure if their parcel has changed in value or ownership.
