PITTSFORD SHEEP FESTIVAL

The Rutland Area Lamb and Wool Producers (RALWP), with support from the American Lamb Board, will hold the 20th annual Pittsford Sheep Festival on Sunday, October 13, 2013. The Festival will be held at a **new location** this year--at the Pittsford Recreation Area on Furnace Road in Pittsford. The Festival hours are 11:00 am to 4:00 pm and admission is free.

The Festival will feature a variety of sheep and wool products and activities. A variety of sheep breeds will be on display. Sheep shearing demonstrations will be held during the afternoon. There will be children's craft activities. A number of vendors will have wool, fiber and craft products available for sale with some vendors demonstrating their crafts. Food, including free lamb samples, will be available during the Festival. Live music will be performed throughout the afternoon.

RALWP is a non-profit group that represents local shepherds. They support local farms and the local community. They provide information on raising sheep, on sheep and wool products.



ROUTE 7 SIDEWALK DISCUSSION

The Vermont Agency of Transportation will be meeting with the Pittsford Select Board at its meeting on Wednesday, October 2 at 6:30 pm to expand discussions on concerns expressed at the recent 502 Hearing on the Village segment of the Route 7 upgrade project before proceeding with its Preliminary Plan development. A primary topic of discussion will include sidewalk locations. Abutting property owners and/or interested parties may wish to attend this meeting to discuss sidewalk safety concerns, access control or other design features affecting their properties or the overall corridor.

MACLURE LIBRARY NEWS & EVENTS

Big Happenings @ your library



The Maclure Library will be up and running with high-speed fiber optic internet access by the end of October! Our community library plays a vital role in helping Pittsford residents become digitally literate. Many people in our community still rely on the library's public access computers for internet access, and if the past few years are any indicator, the demand for high-speed, high capacity broadband will only increase.

Our library was one of 48 libraries chosen to participate in the [Vermont FiberConnect](#) project. Through FiberConnect, we will have access to high-speed, high-capacity fiber optic network with internet service provided via a new shared Wide Area Network (WAN) funded by the Department of Libraries. The WAN provides 100mbps of shared bandwidth for Internet access for the local library networks, as well as wireless access in these libraries.

The Department of Libraries secured an Opportunity Online Broadband Technology grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to help support this project in Vermont libraries.

HEAT Squad customers save an estimated average of 375 gallons of heating fuel per year (based on data reported by Efficiency Vermont).



Homeowners are eligible for up to \$2,000 from Efficiency Vermont when certain efficiency measures are installed (including air sealing, insulation, new heating systems, etc.), with a \$500 bonus if you convert before December 31, 2013.

LISTERS REPORT

The Listers met recently with the District Advisor from the Vermont Dept. of Property Valuation and Review for the annual review of sales of property occurring during the past year. She assisted in determining the sales that were "arms length" transactions as it is only these that are used in calculating the ratio of assessed values to market value.

She also advised that the Listers perform a street by street survey of the Town to check for changes in real property that are not reflected in the Grand List. This is an effort to be sure that all taxpayers are being treated equitably in the Town's property valuation system.

Listers will be visiting all properties that have building permits, particularly those projects that have been completed, to add these to the Grand List.

The Listers remind residents to check with the Zoning Administrator before making any changes to property and to advise the Listers of any mailing address changes.

In order to insulate the outer walls by December 31, the Board voted to apply this year's income of \$3,400 from the fund managed by the Vermont Community Foundation. By meeting Efficiency Vermont's December 31 deadline, we will save around \$1,000 annually on heating fuel; the building and collections will be better protected, and we will qualify for a substantial bonus rebate. These savings will support new educational programs including exhibits, publications and activities for Pittsford school students.
